A selected portion of this training will be presented by experts with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF). The training will be held at the ATF National Academy on the campus of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC). Therefore, the deadline for registration for this course is August 31, 2011 to comply with FLETC Security Clearance Regulations. Registration after this date will be accepted but we will be unable to guarantee attendance until the paperwork has been approved by ATF National Academy on FLETC.

Location

Classes will be held at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC), Glynco, Georgia, in the Brunswick, Georgia area. With the exception of the Sunday, October 30th class which will be held at the Embassy Suites Hotel Brunswick, you are recommend to stay here. Ask for IAAI's special rate of \$119.00.

Qualifications

This is an advanced program. Applicant selection is critical to its effectiveness. Applicants must be a full-time employee of an insurance company working in the investigation, control or management of fire-related cases. Applicants actively employed in **claims, claims management, SIU or related employment will be considered for admission into the program.**

Cost of the five day course is \$745.00. Payment MUST accompany the application. Cost includes registration and extensive course materials. Participants are responsible for their own transportation, lodging and meals.
